## Features

- One command to install

## Installation

If you have Ruby 1.9 and rubygems installed you only need to type

```
gem install docjs
```

## That's Your Part

Because Doc.js basically is language unaware, you have to tell it what to do. This example shows how your documentation could look like

```
/**
 * @function medianight.create_poster
 *
 * This function creates a poster, which can be used at the MediaNight
 * @param [String] term Something like "SS2011"
 * @param [Numeric] dpi The target-resolution of the poster
 * @return [Poster] The finished poster
 */
medianight.create_poster = function(term, dpi) {
  ...
}
```
